Big SIR Comments October 2018

Last month, during our Luncheon Meeting, I discussed the Future of SIRs Task Force recommendations that, if approved by a majority of Branches and State SIRs Board Members, would radically change the structure and operation of the organization. While I believe the recommendations are well-intentioned, our Branch Executive Committee (BEC) was unanimous in our belief they, if implemented, would bring about the demise of SIRs.

Briefly, the Task Force wants to corrupt our name and erase our history (by de-emphasizing SIR's focus on "seniors and retirees"). Make luncheon meeting attendance optional. Make us an "activity group that has luncheons." Make us a "service" organization (one that does volunteering for various causes). Focus new member recruitment on young people. More aggressively involve women in our activities. Eliminate emeritus and inactive status for members. Allow Branches to set their own attendance rules, to allow for more younger members (who have more responsibilities). And, set up alliances with local colleges (to recruit young people).

The Task Force believes the above will enhance declining SIRs membership, and meeting attendance. Our BEC disagrees, and we hope most of the other Branches share our opinion. The State SIRs Board has voted on the Task Force recommendations. As predicted, they unanimously approved them all (except maybe one). Remember, they have six votes. When I received the Board's vote results from our Region Director, Bill Holly, I responded. I pointed out the disparity between our BEC and the Board. We were <u>unanimously against</u>; they were <u>unanimously for</u>. Bill apparently sent my comments on to Derek Southern, our State Director. He called me the next day, while I was out, and left a message that he would like to talk to me about issue. As of this writing, I have not been able to talk to him. I tried, but no response yet.

The vote results (including all Branch votes) should be out within a few weeks. I will report them as soon as I am notified. Also, If I talk to Derek before our Meeting (and it is enlightening), I'll report on that too.
